

INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

The Scientific and Editorial Boards of “GIS Odyssey 2017” are planning to publish conference proceedings and index them in “Web of Science” and “Scopus” databases (15 points according to Polish Ministry Science and Higher Education).

Only original and GIS related research can be submitted for consideration by the Editorial Board.

Preparation of manuscripts

The language of paper is English.

For the publication of research in a joint authorship monographs (text layout, margins, spacing) please use the template (example paper.doc).

Full text of research should be submitted in doc or docx format and send by e-mail to GISOdyssey2017@gmail.com

TEXT:

- justified;
- font - Cambria;
- font size - 10 points;
- general line spacing - single;
- chapter titles - bold, unnumbered, spacing before and after line 6 points
- size sheets - A4;
- margins - 2.5 cm on each side;
- paragraphs - 1.25.

Manuscripts should, in general be organized in the following manner:

- Title, Author(s) name(s) (with/indicate e-mail address),
- Affiliation(s) - in italics,
- Abstract,
- Key words,
- Introduction,
- Material and methods,
- Results and discussion
- Conclusions,
- References

References

Text citations are given as SMITH (1974) or (SMITH, BLACK, 1974). If reference is made in the text written by more than two authors, the first author should be followed by et al. (SMITH et al., 1974). In the list of references all authors must be mentioned. Surnames of authors are written with a comma and initial: SMITH, D. The initials of any additional co-authors, excluding the first, precede the surname: SMITH, D., ROBERTS, A.; BLACK, R.

The list of references should be arranged alphabetically by authors names and chronologically per author. If an author on the list is also mentioned with co-authors, the following order should be used: publications

of a single author arranged chronologically, followed by publications of the same author with more than one co-author. Publications by the same author(s) in the same year should be listed as 1974a, b, c etc., both in the text citations and in the list of references.

References should be arranged in the following manner:

Tables

Tables should be numbered consecutively with all remaining pages. Tables are numbered using Arabic numerals. Avoid vertical lines. Avoid unnecessary bolded text. For the legends and sources use Cambria font size 9 (italics), spacing before and after line 6 points.

Illustrations

Graphs, maps and other illustrations should be of such a size as to allow a reduction by a factor of 4. Figures captions should be typed in italics on a separate sheet of the manuscript. They should be referred to in the text (example):

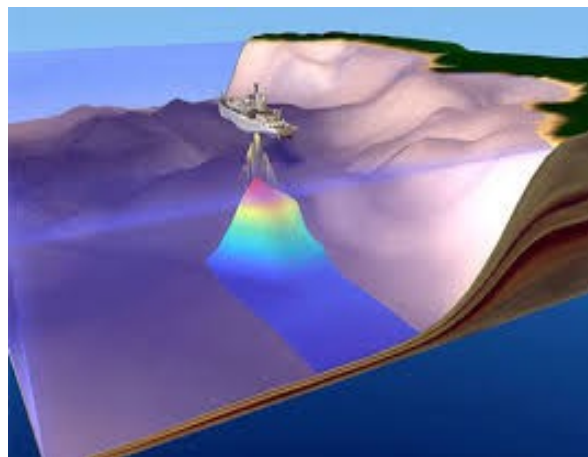


Fig. 1. XXXXXXXX. Source: (xxxx, 2010)

- They showed no differences in survival (Fig. 1).
- The corresponding values of the test solutions are shown in Fig. 1.

For the title and sources use Cambria font size 9 (italics), spacing before and after line 6 points. Photographs with high quality resolution (300 dpi) are also acceptable. Preferable size of photos is 15x10cm. Originals of illustrations and photographs are required. Example:
